About the Trust

The Blue Lamp Trust's vision is to ensure that all vulnerable residents in Hampshire and the Isle of Wight feel safe in their home and online, and to improve road safety nationally.

Our values are to be a trusted service in our community, empathetically supporting vulnerable people, and sharing our expertise to improve safety and security awareness in the home and online.

To be a trusted service provider improving driver safety through comprehensive driver training and development programmes.

Collaboratively working with stakeholders to continue to develop and improve our services and ensure they continue to meet the needs of clients.

Through the free Safe Home scheme we provide services supporting vulnerable and older residents in both counties who have been, or are at risk being the victims of crime or anti-social behaviour, to enable them to feel safe and confident in their homes.

A free Safe Home visit combines both the fitting of practical home safety and security equipment, with home fire safety assessments and general advice on staying safe in their homes.

Our free Safe Online scheme supports residents in Hampshire who may be vulnerable to, or who have been, a victim of an online crime.

Both schemes carry out community engagement activities to promote home and online safety.

The charity's operations are mainly funded by a very successful subsidiary company. BLT Driver Training provides training and assessment for professional drivers across the country through a large pool of independent assessors. The remainder of the funding is currently provided by the Police and Fire Service and some generous corporate sponsors.

Who are we looking for?

We are actively seeking applications from interested candidates with experience in:

Priority will be given to those with experience in **Finance and Legal** to support current vacancies on the board.

Previous experience as a charity Trustee would be beneficial but we welcome interest from all who are looking to give something back to their local community and believe they can contribute to the Trusts important work.

Strong connections to Hampshire and the Isle of Wight would be expected.

The charity is committed to a policy of diversity and inclusion and we welcome applications from a range of backgrounds and experiences to enrich our Board's perspective.

What would we expect from you?

As a trustee, you would play a pivotal role in driving our vision forward, helping shape our strategy, and guiding us in expanding our reach and impact.

We hold 4 Trustees meetings a year at our offices at the Police and Fire Headquarters in Eastleigh, with some online access possible, and possibly a few other larger gatherings.

In addition, it is hoped that successful applicants would have the time to join relevant sub-committees and informal working groups.

Successful applicants would be expected to serve at least one term of 3 years but this could be extended by up to 2 further terms.

The role is unremunerated but pre-agreed reasonable travel expenses would be reimbursed.

SAFE HOME

The Safe Home scheme supports older and vulnerable people within Hampshire and Isle of Wight.

The free service supplies and fits a broad range of home security and fire safety equipment, including:

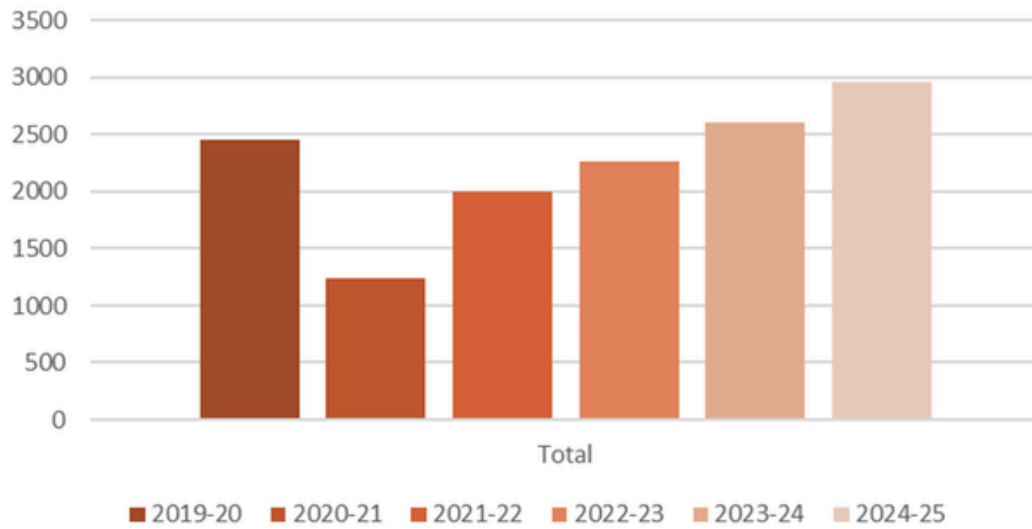
- Door and Window Locks
- Spy Holes
- Window Alarms
- Door Chains
- Smoke Alarms
- Carbon Monoxide Detectors
- Personal Alarms
- Letterbox Security

Key safes and video doorbells are offered to clients at additional charge. The doorbells act as a deterrent to opportunist criminals and can possibly give useful evidence to the police, while the key safes allow access for family, carers and emergency services.

Our Safety Technicians carry out community talks and attend events to raise awareness of the charity and promote home safety and security.

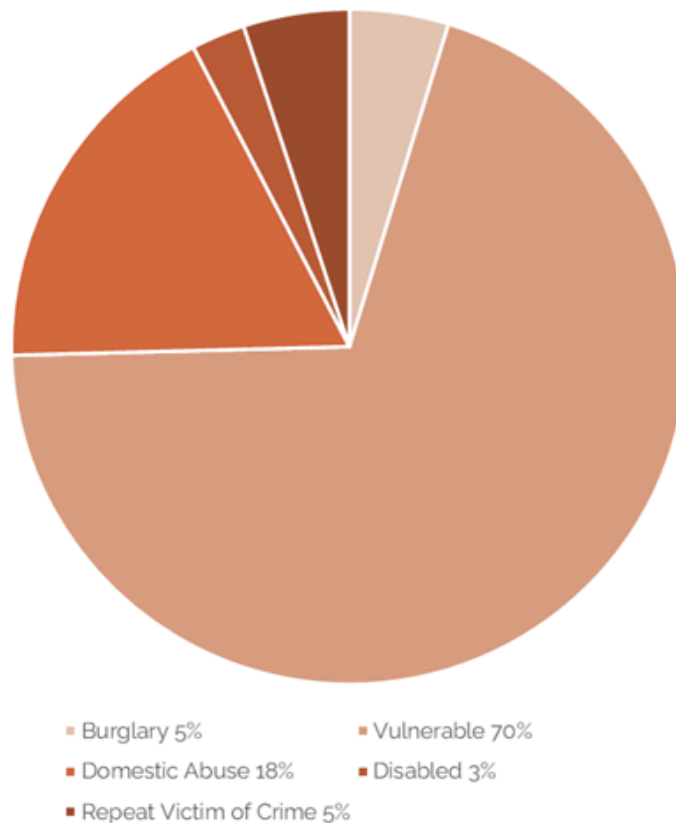


Bobby Visits



In 2024/25 the number of visits increased, year on year growing over 13%. This has enabled 349 more households to feel safe and secure at home.

Reasons for a Bobby Visit





The Safe Online scheme started in January 2022 and provides free home visits within Hampshire. The Blue Lamp Trust has police-vetted and trained Volunteer Advisers who visit clients in their own home and give advice and guidance on basic IT security and how to avoid being affected by a cyber-crime or a cyber enabled crime.

They cover such things as:

- What is cyber-crime?
- Cyber and scam prevention advice
- How to check privacy settings
- Signposting to other advice and resources
- How to report issues
- How to recognise scam emails and text messages

Talks to community groups are carried out and community events are attended to raise awareness of the service and share advice about cyber-crime.

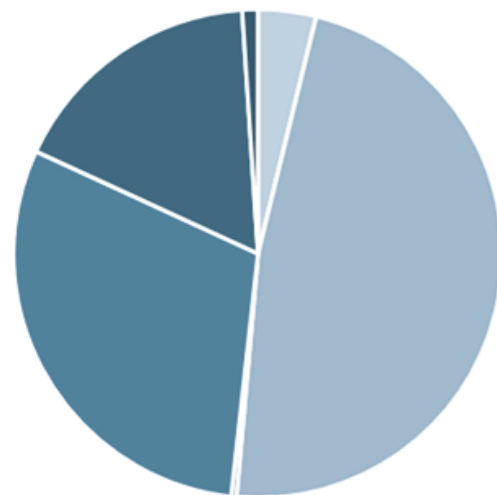

Management

Day-to-day management of the Trust, and its trading subsidiary, Blue Lamp Trust (Services) Ltd, is delegated to the Chief Executive Officer, according to a Scheme of Delegation approved by Trustees. The Chief Executive Officer reports to Trustees and works with a team of senior managers.

Senior Managers include; Commercial Manager, Charity Services Manager and Financial Controller.

The work of both the Safe Home and Safe Online schemes is delivered by the Charity Services Manager, 2 office administrators, 6 Safety Technicians and 4 Volunteer Advisers.

The driver training services are overseen by the Commercial Manager who has overall responsibility for a team of 3 administrators and 80 sub-contracted trainers and assessors working nationally.
